Rabbi's Message

Dear Friends:

Membership in the Temple gives respect to the Jewish people. We live in a society of many different political and social organizations, mainline churches and numerous religious groups. Certainly we Jews ought to be able to support a synagogue, a Jewish school and other vital Jewish institutions. I express my admiration and gratitude to each of you for being affiliated and for supporting our Congregation, B'nai Emet. Having our own facility gives us dignity and enhances our status in the community. Every Jewish person is proud of our Congregation.



Unfortunately, a large number of Jewish people remain unaffiliated and are not involved with the Congregation. We all have friends and relatives who do not belong. I would like to suggest that you invite them to come and join us. At some time or other, everybody calls the Temple or the Rabbi for some service and they expect to get it. Some large Temples have a policy that the staff only serve Temple members. I do not agree with that policy, but I understand it. We often see the warning on tickets or coupons, "void if detached." Jews who detach themselves, in a sense, make themselves void, which according to Webster's dictionary means useless, ineffective, empty, of no legal force.

Our Jewish tradition teaches us that we are part of a family, the House of Israel. We are taught to help one another and assist each other.

In our day, when so many people call the Temple for guidance, for help, for a family event, everyone should belong to a synagogue and be counted as part of the family.

CBE offers educational, religious and social programs for people of every age. If there is a project that you would like to have that presently does not exist, come and help us establish it. The Temple is for you and everyone. The Temple is what you make it! So, come to shul and bring others along. You will be filled with contentment, make special friends, and have a sense of a meaningful life.

Our Vice-President for membership, Ruth Ann Rossman, is very gracious, and will be happy to welcome and accommodate you in every way.

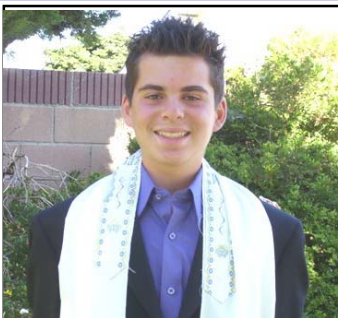

Jewish Life Center

The Jewish Life Center has entered into an escrow with Our Redeemer Lutheran Church at 9 W. Bonita in Simi Valley.

This 45 day escrow period did not come about easily. In order for the escrow on the Bonita Church to close, it is dependent upon the sale of the land at Royal/Corto. The sale of the land at Royal/Corto is dependent upon the purchaser's (Community Dynamics aka Com Dyn) ability to get financing from independent investors to fund Com Dyn's project at Royal/Corto. Com Dyn needs to get independent investors because all of their usual financial entities won't invest in any residential building real estate ventures (at this moment) due to the current economic climate. During this period we can all hope and pray Com Dyn is able to obtain investors to allow us to go forward.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Jewish Life Center Board of Directors (Carole Fineberg, Illise Holran, Nirit Levy, Lindy Schneider, Debbie Knecht, Lloyd Picker, Michael Hollander, Nancy Micon, Bruce Cohen, Tim Hensel, Meridith Patera, Jeff Ringer, Margy Rosenbluth, and Shelly Botan). A big thanks to our constant cheerleader, Cantor Russ. Few of you have visited our meetings to know the great amount of time, energy and thought these individuals put into making a decision. Each of them feels a tremendous burden to try to figure out what long term effects their decision and vote will have on the entire Jewish community of Simi Valley. The board has also consulted with an attorney (from Ventura) to make sure our actions are in accordance with state and federal guidelines for a non-profit organization. Earl and Eric, again **THANK YOU!!!!**

It has not been done without a lot of hard work. This is only the beginning of the work and dedication we will need in order to see our community expand and grow.

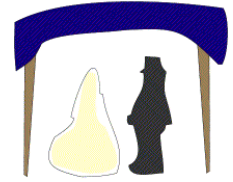

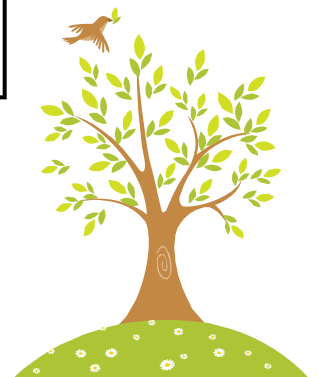
